


The Effects of the Energy Sector on Climate Change and Energy Transformation Webinar (25 May 2022)

Globally, energy production and consumption are by far the largest sources of greenhouse gas emissions. About two-thirds of global greenhouse gas emissions are linked to burning fossil fuels for energy to be used for heating, electricity, transportation and industry usage. Therefore, it is almost impossible to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions and have an impact on the climate crisis without changing our energy practices. The webinar organized by BAU, CIFAL Istanbul Youth Platform under CIFAL Istanbul and UNITAR in collaboration with BAU Energy Student Club and Akenerji aimed to discuss new and emerging technologies at the youth level and to raise awareness on the subject.

TÜBİTAK Climate Change Research Projects Competition Preparation Conference (6 April 2022)

In this online contact meeting organized by Uğur Schools in collaboration with BAU, Cifal Istanbul and UNITAR, BAU academics gave training on how students should prepare for TÜBİTAK Climate Change research projects, and which issues they should focus on during the process. As part of BAU's efforts on contributing to environmental sustainability, the event helped to create awareness among youth about the climate crisis and the environmental challenges it brings.



"Animal Law" Online Training (30 March 2022)

This online training focused on the problems related to animal rights in Türkiye. Within this context, discussion topics such as violence against animals, systematic torture, industrial animal husbandry, hunting, zoos and dolphin parks were examined. Information was shared on potential and ongoing animal lawsuits.

"Litigation in Animal Law" Online Training (5 May 2022)

In this online training, participants gained awareness about the procedures of opening a case in Animal Law. Over a case on willful animal murder students discussed and learned about litigation in Animal Law.





Heybeliada Trekking Trip and Environmental Cleaning Activity (11 June 2022)

In order to attract attention to the increasing environmental pollution in the world and to raise awareness on environmental problems among young people, a garbage collection and trekking activity was organized in Heybeliada in cooperation with Cifal Istanbul Youth Platform and BAU Young TEMA Club.

Animal and Nature Law Lab under the BAU Faculty of Law

Animal and Nature Law Lab examines and researches the legal status of non-humans and works on animal and nature law with the support of voluntary students. Its areas of focus involve animal rights, green constitutional order, climate focus and the right to a healthy environment. The Lab aims to organize reading and discussion meetings as well as debates with students, to search and archive resources, to conduct research and to provide resource support to researchers, to write reports, to compile decisions made in animal and nature-related cases in our country and abroad. The Lab will carry out academic activities such as providing legal support to lawyers, preparing amicus curiae for courts, translating news and academic studies published in foreign languages and publishing them online or in print, organizing various conferences, panels and interviews.

"Sexual Violence Against Animals" Workshop (5 June 2022)

The face-to-face workshop was organized in collaboration with the Association for Struggle Against Sexual Violence and HAKIM. The training module was adopted from the "Change Begins with Me" workshop by the Association for Struggle Against Sexual Violence in order to change sociocultural misconceptions pertaining to sexual violence, to increase the reach of protective-preventive practices, to increase awareness about the individual responsibilities in the fight against sexual violence. The training was conducted by providing participants with detailed information about the types, causes and solutions of sexual violence against animals and included group exercises and presentations.






"Elazığ Shelter Case" Online Talk (23 January 2022)

Stating that they want to open the products grown in the region to the international arena, Yücel said, "We are establishing an area in Piraziz together with Bahçeşehir University and the United Nations Agricultural Organization. This area is a center for implementing smart agriculture that can shape the agriculture of the future. We want to reveal the endemic plants of the Black Sea, to taste the local dishes related to them, and to open the gastronomy of this region to the international arena. I think we will have achieved our goal if we can provide studies and training to our people on this subject. I hope that these studies will play important roles, especially in the employment of women. We will provide training here. We will have application areas and we will give examples to the participants on how their hand-made products can reach international markets. "Our aim is to show how the valuable plants growing in these lands can be used in agriculture and medicine in the application area of our university," he said.
